Flagstaff Becomes a Sustainability Leader

The City of Flagstaff, Arizona is partnering with Coconino County to implement a comprehensive sustainability strategy with its Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant (EECBG) funding. Flagstaff is leveraging this federal investment to **promote local energy independence, increase economic vitality and facilitate social inclusion.**

Flagstaff is using EECBG funding to ...

- **Support the Energy Conservation Corps**, modeled after the Civilian Conservation Corps, which provides apprenticeship-style training and on-the-job skill development opportunities in energy efficiency for underemployed and dislocated workers throughout Coconino County.
- Subsidize residential buildings' energy audits and energy and water efficiency upgrades in order to reduce consumption and **lower utility bills by a total of \$162,000.**
- Capitalize on a unique collaboration among the public sector, private industry, educational institutions, non-profit organizations, and community groups in the northern Arizona region — **this regional approach is a catalyst to behavioral change and is supported by coordinated housing and energy programming and services.**

Impact on Flagstaff, AZ

- \$587,100 in EECBG funding
- 11 jobs to be created or retained
- 4,126,367 kilowatt-hours of energy saved
- 2,033 metric tons of CO₂e emissions avoided
